Wetland Agent Approvals:

Petition 10-1F - Ruth Way, 720 Gilead Street, Hebron, CT – Notification of Timber Harvest

The Way family has decided to pursue a thinning aimed at the long term management of the forest resource.

Access for log trucks will be the existing farm road on Meeting House Road. Joan Nichols to check next week with Mr. Ellis for permission to skid logs in the cornfield abutting the Way property.

Joan Nichols states in her letter, that there will be no impact on the wetlands or intermittent watercourse.

Violations:

Violation 08-18V – Patti Matthews, 108 Jan Drive, Hebron – Excavation of soils within a wetland

No new business to report, J. Soderberg to check on it.

Pre-Applications: Helen Boucher, 32 Lebanon Road (Rt. 207) – They want to lower the brook, so it won't flood their property. They do not have any plan in place.

The Conservation Commission agrees that this proposal would require more information. It also believes it would be denied if the proposal went to a Public Hearing.

Other Pertinent Business:

Discontinuance and Abandonment of Certain Roads

J. Soderberg stated that the roads are not maintained at the present time.

If proposal is done, J. Mullaney suggested cleaning up the roads to trails could possibly be a Scout project.

R. Warner and T. Nofer said they would be the two to work with the PZC to oversee this project.

Correspondence:


The following correspondence was received:

- February 2, 2010 Permit Application from Aquatic Control Technology, Inc. RE: To apply aquatic pesticides to Amston Lake.
J. Mullaney said he sent a letter last year stating the Conservation Commission is not supportive of this intent. He said he will send another letter to DEP stating same.
- Request for Proposals – Implementing Recommendations from the Salmon River Watershed Municipal Land Use Evaluation Project with two pilot towns. J. Mullaney would support being a pilot town. He will speak to M. O’Leary regarding this.
